If there are any brief announcements they are made at this time.

GREETING AND BLESSING

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

The blessing is given in the following simple form or using one particular to the feast or season.

May almighty God bless you, the Father, and the Son, + and the Holy Spirit. Amen.

DISMISSAL

The priest sends everyone forth to love and serve the Lord, all respond

Thanks be to God.

Sharing in Holy Communion

In the celebration of the Eucharist Catholics celebrate and participate in a living sign of unity. This unity is unity with Christ, and it is unity with the Catholic Church. What is most easily seen is the unity of those present gathered at a particular time and place, but the still deeper reality made present in the sacramental celebration is their union with the whole of the local Church, united under the Bishop, and the Church universal, united in communion with the Pope.

To our fellow Christians: Because of the nature of the Communion we celebrate at Mass, we are not free ordinarily to invite members of non-Catholic churches and ecclesial bodies not in communion with the Pope to join us in Holy Communion. Sharing in the Eucharist in exceptional circumstances by non-Catholics requires permission of the diocesan bishop and in accordance with the provisions of canon law, (canon 844 no 3, 4). Please pray with us for the healing of division within the Church, the Body of Christ.

To all who are not Christians: We welcome you in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, and rejoice to recognize you as members of the family of God, made in the image and likeness of God. We cannot invite you to join us in receiving Holy Communion, but we ask you to pray with us for the peace and unity of the whole human family and for a deeper understanding between those of different faiths.

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Order of Mass

INTRODUCTORY RITES

in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done, and in what I have failed to do; and I ask blessed Mary, ever virgin, all the angels and saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life. **Amen.**

The priest invites all the people to join in the Lord's Prayer

The priest continues alone

Deliver us, Lord, from every evil, and grant us peace in our day. In your mercy keep us free from sin and protect us from all anxiety as we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ.
