## PROCESSION OF THE BOOK OF THE GOSPELS

Following the Homily the book of the Gospels is processed through the church while a Litany of the Word or other processional chant is sung (or said).

The Book of the Gospels is placed in a prominent position at the Ambo and honoured with incense.

## PLACING OF THE GOSPELS

At the Ambo the deacon or priest holding the Book aloft, proclaims:

O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good:  
for his steadfast love endures for ever!

As the compass points are mentioned the ministers turns and faces that direction.

Let the redeemed of the Lord say so  
for he has gathered them from the lands,  
from the east and from the west,  
from the north and from the south.

‘Heaven and earth will pass away,  
but my words will not pass away,’ says the Lord.

℟. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

## GOSPEL CANTICLE

ANT.: Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God.  
Behold, you will conceive and bear a son, alleluia.
