Eucharistic Celebration

INTRODUCTION

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The World Day of Migrants and Refugees (WDMR) is a day kept aside to remember all the people in the world who are displaced due to many circumstances; it may be with choice or forcibly. It is celebrated on the last Sunday of the month of September. This day gives us an opportunity to show our concern and respect with dignity, the people who are part of us from other places or country. This year, our Holy Father Pope Francis has chosen the theme, "Free to choose whether to migrate or to stay".

Pope Francis in his message on the World Day of Migrants and Refugees 2023 says, "even as we work to ensure that in every case migration is the fruit of a free decision, we are called to show maximum respect for the dignity of each migrant; this entails accompanying and managing waves of migration as best we can, constructing bridges and not walls, expanding channels for a safe and regular migration. In whatever place we decide to build our future, in the country of our birth or elsewhere, the important thing is that there should always be a community ready to welcome, protect, promote and integrate everyone, without distinction and without excluding anyone".

In this Eucharistic Celebration, let us remember all the people who are on their migratory journey from place to place or country to country to have a better life. This journey may be of their choice and free decision or they may be forced to take up this journey. May they experience a welcoming and respectful atmosphere and that the receiving community may have more understanding and respect them with dignity. May the grace and spirit of our creator always enable us to create a safe and welcoming space.



Offertory Symbols with Reflection

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Globe: "God saw everything that He had made, and indeed, it was very good" (Gen.1:31). As we offer this globe, let us acknowledge the importance of each other, as we live in this world which was created with love. May we live giving respect and dignity to people in all walks of life with its own uniqueness, and care for our common home and feel the warmth of love.

Crossroads: We don't meet people by coincidence, they are meant to cross our paths for reasons unknown to us. Compassionate Lord, we place before you all the migrants and refugees who are torn from their homes, family and everything familiar to them. May they experience the warmth of your love, especially, through the hearts of young, old and the most vulnerable among them. Open our hearts to receive them as our sisters and brothers in whose face we see you.

Bridge: Bridge symbol of connection. It connects us with God in our spiritual life and with people in social life. We place all the organizations who work for social issues of giving a dignified life to the people who are at the margins. May they continue to be the bridge which will enables people to travel in a community of love and respect.





Pen: The pen is a powerful tool of the educated people. We pray for authorities who have the power to frame the laws of their country, especially the government servants. May all those in authority be able to understand the situation of the migrants and refugees and design laws/policies which will benefit these groups of people. May they be guaranteed safety and the basic needs for a human person.



Bread and Wine: Lord Jesus when you multiplied the loaves and fishes, you provided more than food for the body. We acknowledge the work of human hands, especially that of the migrants and refugees, who help us in our day-to-day work. May the compassion which you showed to the hungry crowd inspire us to respect and accept their contribution to the growth of society.
